

-OBSERVING THE SACRAMENT-

The Lord's Supper

We celebrate the Lord's Supper by coming forward (generally from the back of the sanctuary to the front, though you may commune at any time) and partaking of the bread and the cup. Wine is served in the inner rings of each tray; grape juice in the outer ring. We warmly invite to the Table all baptized Christians, who are living under the authority of Christ and his body, the Church. By eating the bread and drinking of the cup, you are acknowledging that you are a sinner, without hope except in the sovereign mercy of God, and that you are trusting in Christ alone for salvation. If this does not describe you, we are glad you are here and commend to you the following prayers for your use during this time.

A Prayer for those Searching for the Truth

Jesus, you claim to be the way, the truth, and the life. Grant that I might be undaunted by the cost of following you as I consider the reasons for doing so. Guide me, teach me, and open to me the reality of who you are. Give me an understanding of you that is coherent, convincing, and leads to the life you promise. Amen.

A Prayer of Belief

Lord Jesus, I admit that I am weaker and more sinful than I ever believed, but through you I am more loved and accepted than I ever dared hope. I thank you for paying my debt, bearing my punishment on the cross, and offering forgiveness and new life. I turn from my sins and receive you as Savior and Lord. Amen.

A Prayer for those Struggling with Sin

Lord Jesus, grant that I may see in you the fulfillment of all my need and may turn from every false pleasure to feed on you, the true and living bread. Prayer Concerns

Hilltop Presbyterian Church: Rev. Jon Neville is planting a church in Ferndale. Pray for God's blessing as he gives himself to this new work, and that the Lord leads him to many who are hungry to hear and respond to the gospel.

The Keeper of Our Lives: The psalmist writes, "The LORD is your shade on your right hand. The sun shall not strike you by day, nor the moon by night. The LORD will keep you from all evil; he will keep your life. The LORD will keep your going out and your coming in from this time forth and forevermore" (Ps 121.5-8). In addition to strength and healing, pray that *Sandy Cupolillo, the Early family, Mike Givens, Tom Manning, and Rick & Vickie Myers* know God's protective and comforting hand in the week ahead.

The Pacific Northwest Presbytery is meeting this Thursday and Friday at Evergreen Presbyterian Church in Beaverton. Pray for travel mercies for the ministers and elders attending, and that their work honors the Lord and is a blessing to the church.

The Persecuted Church: There are only a few thousand Christians out of half a million people living in *Maldives*, a small country on the Arabian Sea. The government requires all citizens to be Muslim; conversion from Islam results in loss of citizenship and severe punishment under Sharia law. Even foreign workers who are Christians are closely watched, and churches are outlawed. Pray that God gives the Maldives' leaders a willingness to condone other religions. Pray that the Lord leads secret believers to find fellowship with one another and access to the Bible. And pray that many who are enslaved in sin will turn to Christ and experience forgiveness and true freedom.

Announcements

Sunday Evening Worship & Cultural Engagement: Beginning tonight, we are adding an evening service on the second Sunday of each month, from 6:00 to 7:15 PM. It will include a brief time of worship followed by teaching and discussion of issues relevant to our society's cultural moment. Explanation of the Cover Symbol

The Chi Rho symbol is one of the most ancient Christian symbols. XP, the first two letters of the Greek "Christ," is an abbreviation of the name of the Lord. This symbol is often, as here, accompanied with other symbols, in this case "Alpha" and "Omega," the first and last letters of the Greek alphabet. The symbol originates from Revelation 22.13: "I am the Alpha and the Omega, the First and the Last, the Beginning and the End" (cf. Revelation 1.8, 17; 21.6). This particular symbol dates from the first few centuries of the Christian era and is often found on tombs.
