-OBSERVING THE SACRAMENTS-

The Lord's Supper

We celebrate the Lord's Supper by coming forward (generally from the back of the sanctuary to the front) and partaking of the bread and the cup. Wine is served in the inner ring of each tray, grape juice in the outer rings. We warmly invite to the Table all baptized Christians, who are living under the authority of Christ and his body, the Church. By eating the bread and drinking of the cup, you are acknowledging that you are a sinner, without hope except in the sovereign mercy of God, and that you are trusting in Christ alone for salvation. If this does not describe you, we are glad you are here and commend to you the following prayers for your use during this time.

A Prayer for those Searching for the Truth

Jesus, you claim to be the way, the truth, and the life. Grant that I might be undaunted by the cost of following you as I consider the reasons for doing so. Guide me, teach me, and open to me the reality of who you are. Give me an understanding of you that is coherent, convincing, and leads to the life you promise. Amen.

A Prayer of Belief

Lord Jesus, I admit that I am weaker and more sinful than I ever believed, but through you I am more loved and accepted than I ever dared hope. I thank you for paying my debt, bearing my punishment on the cross, and offering forgiveness and new life. I turn from my sins and receive you as Savior and Lord. Amen.

Prayer Concerns

Help From on High: David prayed, “Many are saying of me, ‘God will not deliver him.’ But you, LORD, are a shield around me, my glory, the One who lifts my head high. I call out to the LORD, and he answers me from his holy mountain. I lie down and sleep; I wake again, because the LORD sustains me. I will not fear though tens of thousands assail me on every side” (Ps 3.2-6). In addition to strength and healing, pray that *Paul Carmichael, Sandy Cupolillo, Mike Givens, Nancy Hoeft, Judie Jud, Tom Manning, Rick & Vickie Myers* and *Danielle Parker* know God’s protection from every fear as they call out to him.

The Persecuted Church: There are nearly 2 million Christians out of 21 million people in *Sri Lanka*, a country where Christians continue to reel from Islamic jihadists, as well as from radical Buddhist and Hindu groups that harass and discriminate against converts to Christianity. Pray for those who have lost loved ones at the hands of violent extremists, that God comforts and strengthens them in the faith. Pray for the church of Sri Lanka, that it grows despite the suffering it is enduring. And pray for protection from further attacks on Christians and Christian churches.

Redeemer Presbyterian Church: Pray for Rev. Jeff Glover, our church planter in Soldotna, AK as he shepherds the flock and trains men as officers who will help him do the same.

Rev. Alister & Sarah Torrens (Ukraine): Alister hopes to make another trip back to Ukraine in the next few weeks. Pray for the timing and logistics of this endeavor, that God keeps him safe and blesses his ministry there. Pray for Sarah and the children, back in Northern Ireland, while he is gone. And, of course, continue to pray for those in Ukraine, suffering the ravages of this war, that they would be spared and the war would soon come to an end.

Explanation of Cover Symbol

The anchor is an ancient Christian symbol for hope. It is derived from Hebrews 6.19: “We have this hope as an anchor for the soul...” When combined with a cross it makes plain that Christian hope is in Christ and His redemption. The symbol was frequently used in this sense in the catacombs of ancient Rome.
