The Lord's Supper

We celebrate the Lord's Supper by coming forward (generally from the back of the sanctuary to the front) and partaking of the bread and the cup. Wine is served in the clear cups, grape juice in the colored cups. We warmly invite to the Table all baptized Christians, who are living under the authority of Christ and his body, the Church. By eating the bread and drinking of the cup, you are acknowledging that you are a sinner, without hope except in the sovereign mercy of God, and that you are trusting in Christ alone for salvation. If this does not describe you, we are glad you are here and commend to you the following prayers for your use during this time.

A Prayer for those Searching for the Truth

Jesus, you claim to be the way, the truth, and the life. Grant that I might be undaunted by the cost of following you as I consider the reasons for doing so. Guide me, teach me, and open to me the reality of who you are. Give me an understanding of you that is coherent, convincing, and leads to the life you promise. Amen.

A Prayer of Belief

Prayer Concerns

Saint Andrews Presbyterian Church (Yakima): Pray for the new elders and deacon as they carry out their work of leading the church alongside Rev. Craig Harris. Pray for the congregation as they adjust to this new phase of ministry, with a Session in place. And pray for continued outreach opportunities and for the Lord's continued financial provision.

Deliverance From Every Fear: David prayed, "I sought the LORD, and he answered me; he delivered me from all my fears" (Ps 34.4). In addition to strength and healing, pray that this week *Kristi Alden, Leslie Carmichael, Judie Jud, Tom Manning, Rick Myers, Jacob Schroeder,* and *Verne Snavely* might know God's deliverance from every fear.

Rev. Tom & Melissa Manning: Tom's health and strength continue to improve. He and Melissa will travel to Egypt and Jordan June 22 – July 9. Tom will speak 10 times and Melissa twice at a conference for missionaries, then they will visit team leaders they have been coaching from a distance and old friends they continue to disciple from a far. Pray that God readies them for this trip, and that Tom's strength continues to multiply.

The Persecuted Church: There are 118 million professing Christians out of 144 million people living in *Russia*. In Muslim-dominated regions, those who convert from Islam suffer persecution from family, friends, and community members. The far greater threat, however, comes from the government, which surveils its citizens. Pray for the safety of church members when they are arrested and interrogated by the police. And pray that suspicion of Protestants who receive support from foreign organizations will not be an impediment to the growth and health of the church in Russia.
